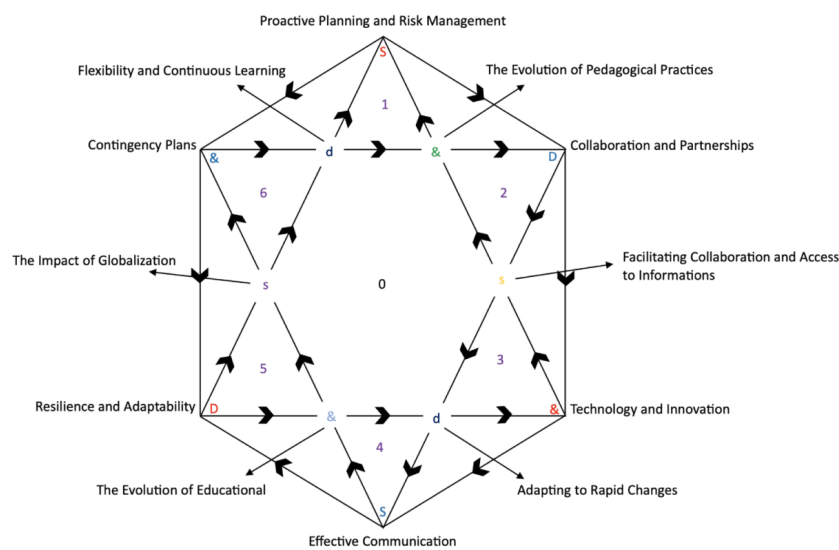

## Sustainable vector model components.

Component	Description	Practical Implications
<b>Sustainability Indicators</b>	Metrics used to measure energy efficiency, resource optimization, and student engagement.	Provide actionable data for institutional planning and decision-making.
<b>Sustainable Vector</b>	Measuring the impact of sustainability.	Evaluating the curriculum.
<b>Feedback Loops</b>	Dynamic mechanisms for analyzing and improving institutional processes over time.	Help identify inefficiencies and optimize processes in real-time.
<b>Commutative Diagrams</b>	Visual tools used to model relationships and cycles in higher education systems.	Facilitate understanding of complex system dynamics for stakeholders.
<b>Mathematical Constructs (e.g., Fractals)</b>	Advanced mathematical concepts that provide structural coherence and adaptability.	Support scalability and adaptation of the model to various contexts.
<b>Fractals</b>	Identification of repetitive patterns.	Optimization of educational resources.
<b>Automorphisms</b>	Analysis of structural changes.	Organizational management.
<b>Resource Allocation Strategies</b>	Frameworks for efficient distribution of educational resources.	Ensure equitable and effective resource usage aligned with sustainability goals.

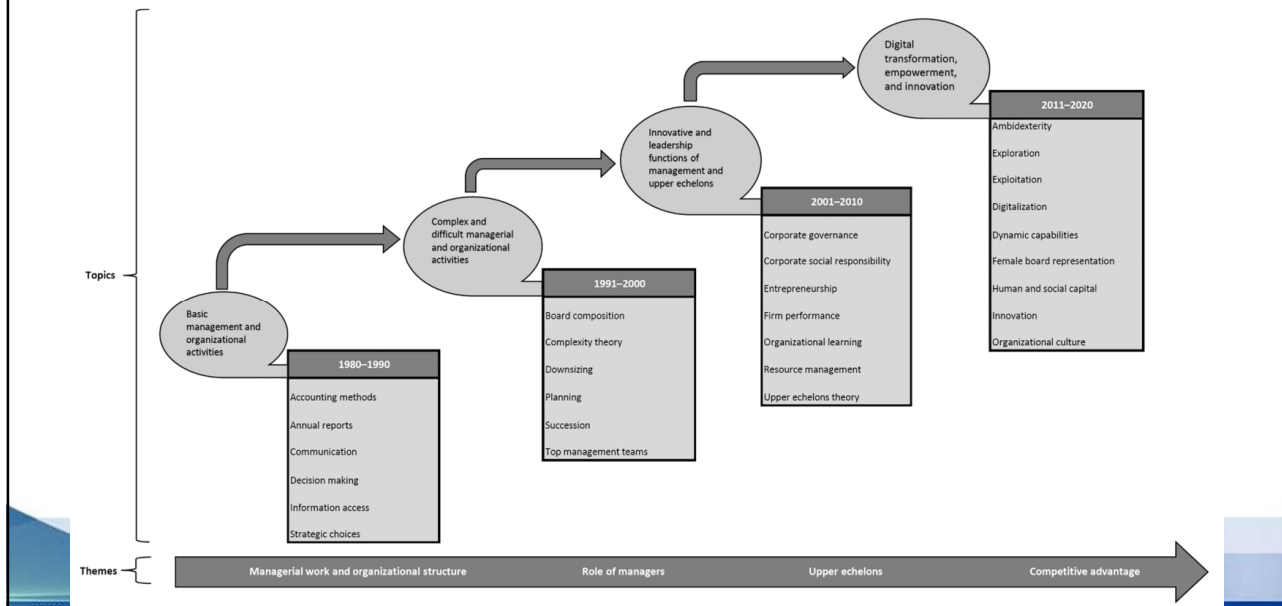


## **The state of the art of strategic leadership**

**Strategic leadership was introduced in an article on “strategic choice” by Child (1972), who suggested that powerful individuals make strategic decisions based on the strategic choices that are available to them at a particular point in time, and that such decisions can impact myriad aspects of the organization, such as its goals and structure.**

**Most top management leadership is headed by a principals, who is responsible for making strategic decisions and managing the overall operations and resources of the entire organization rather than a single unit in that organization.**
